*OTHER HORIZONS. Walking, knowing, discovering*

The new book of the Dialoghi di Pistoia series is released on April 19

On Tuesday 19 April the new volume of the series of Dialoghi di Pistoia books, published by UTET, entitled *OTHER HORIZONS. Walking, knowing, discovering*. An anthology of essays by Marco Aime, Duccio Demetrio, Adriano Favole, Vera Gheno, Marco Vannini and Alessandro Vanoli, on the theme of the journey and the journey explored in the XII edition of the contemporary anthropology festival (pp. 112; € 14) .

Six thinkers offer the reader reflections on the yearning that marked the evolution of mankind: setting out on a journey to discover the world and oneself. The journey towards new horizons, the pilgrimage of scholars, the adventure of explorers: it is the movement that has made us human; the *fil rouge* of the book is the need to go beyond the here and now in search of forms of spirituality, new encounters, other geographical, linguistic or philosophical horizons.

With 19 books published and a total circulation of over 100,000 copies, the series – conceived and directed by Giulia Cogoli and promoted by the Cassa di Risparmio di Pistoia and Pescia Foundation – has been one of the tools with which, for the past 10 years, the Dialogues of Pistoia provide an ever-growing audience with opportunities for cultural study, beyond the three-day event.

The collection addresses the relationship between movement and knowledge, because moving is the only possibility to broaden the horizon of what we know more and more.

The anthropologist **Marco Aime** tells the story of two women who, at the beginning of the twentieth century, challenged the masculine environment of anthropology to leave the academy and carry out field research; the philosopher **Duccio Demetrio** describes the relationship between thought and path, identifying in the movement the philosophical metaphor of the human condition; the anthropologist **Adriano Favole** examines Bruce Chatwin's travel reports to find that sense of wandering that can help us examine the present and relearn how to move into a post-pandemic world.

With the sociolinguist **Vera Gheno** we proceed to an observation of the elusive wandering of the language, necessary to extricate ourselves from the complexity of the present; the philosopher **Marco Vannini** starts from Petrarch's ascent to Monte Ventoso to talk to us about the expansion of external horizons, a privileged point of view on the interior to truly know one's soul. The last text is from the historian **Alessandro Vanoli** ranging from the Sindbad legend to the *Million* by Marco Polo to show us how the human mind has always imagined fabulous worlds even before observing them, and how it was the power of the imagination that pushed us beyond the unknown.

**Marco Aime** teaches Cultural Anthropology at the University of Genoa. He has conducted research in the Alps and in West Africa (Benin, Burkina Faso, Mali). He has published children's fairy tales, fiction texts and essays.

**Duccio Demetrio** he taught Philosophy of Education and Storytelling at the Bicocca in Milan. He is the founder of the Free University of Autobiography of Anghiari and of the Academy of Silence.

**Adriano Favole** he is professor of cultural anthropology at the University of Turin. His research fields are overseas Europe, political anthropology, cultural creativity.

**Vera Gheno**, sociolinguist, translator from Hungarian and popularizer, she collaborated for twenty years with the Accademia della Crusca and for four years with the Zanichelli publishing house. You teach at the University of Florence.

**Marco Vannini**, a philosopher, has always been committed to recovering the great mystical-speculative tradition. Directs the necklace *The hidden treasure* and the magazine *Mysticism and Philosophy* for the publisher Le Lettere.

**Alessandro Vanoli** he is a historian and writer. He taught at the University of Bologna and at the University of Milan, specializing in the history of the Mediterranean and the Islamic presence in Spain and Sicily.
